He was a PO2 (Petty Officer 2nd class), Aviation Structural Mechanic (Hydraulics) serving as an F-8 Crusader Systems Organization Maintenance Technician. He also served as a P-2 Neptune Organizational Maintenance Technician. He was a Vietnam Era Veteran earning medals and awards commensurate with his honorable service.
